

## JOB OPPORTUNITY

The Department of Public Law, Public International and European Law, Section of Constitutional and Administrative Law has vacancies for two 50% post-doc positions or one 100 percent post-doc position (€1944.75 gross (50%, 14 times per year).

✿ **Start date:** 1 March 2020.

✿ **Employment duration:** Two years.

✿ **Working hours per week:** 2 x 20 hours per week (1 x 50% allocated to the department, 1 x 50% allocation to the project “European Constitutional Court Network”) or 1 x 40 hours per week.

✿ **Working hours:** by arrangement.

✿ **Workplace:** University of Salzburg.

### 1. Position (20h, 50% allocation to the department in the team of Prof. Dr. András Jakab):

- **Job description:** independent scientific research and teaching, scientific support in research and teaching as well as participation in administrative tasks at the department of constitutional and administrative law; carrying out independent teaching in German to the extent of two semester hours per week.

- **Job requirements:** completed PhD in law.

- **Desired additional qualifications:** excellent dissertation, ideally published; good IT and language skills (especially German and English, possibly also one West Slavic language); and empirical social science knowledge.

### 2. Position (50% allocation to the “European Constitutional Court Network” project directed by Dr. Lando Kirchmair and Dr. Lisa Lechner):

- **Job description:** Contribution to the project (for more information, see <https://eccn.at/>); in particular automatic text analysis; creation of citation networks;

review and application of results, particularly with the inclusion of West Slavic legal systems.

- **Job requirements:** Completed PhD in law, political science or another relevant degree.
- **Desired additional qualifications:** excellent dissertation, ideally published; good IT and language skills (especially English, German and possibly also one West Slavic language); empirical knowledge of social science; ideally knowledge of quantitative text analysis and possibly also network analysis; programming skills or knowledge of the software "R" and/or "Python" would also be desirable.

**The two positions (each 20 hours per week) can be merged in case of a strong application. This person would then receive a 100% position (i.e. 40 hours per week).**

**Desired personal traits for both positions:** ability to work in a team, organisational skills, strong interest in scientific work.
